OUR IMPACT

- UAC's Fiscal Sponsorship structure **saves partner organizations up to 20% of overhead expenses** relative to similar organizations.
- Our network of 55+ partner organizations and programs **serve more than 150,000 children, youth, and adults annually**.
- We **place and support over 1,600 low-income youth ages 14-21** in summer employment.
- Each year we partner with Brown's ShopRite and more than 80 community organizations to **provide 1,000 Thanksgiving baskets feeding over 6,000 individuals in need**.
- Our Economic Development Division facilitates economic inclusion, which **has produced \$287M in wages to minorities and women** and **\$1.8B in contracts to M/W/DsBEs**.
- Our Community and Economic Development (CED) division has **leveraged \$15.8M in home purchases** in Philadelphia through a network of 23 employers and the City of Philadelphia through the **Home Buy Now Program**.
