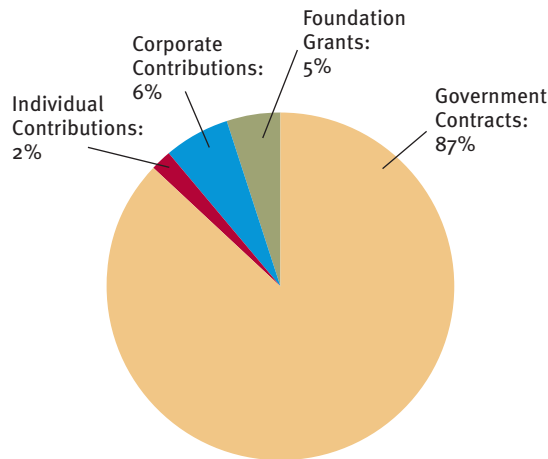

The Urban Affairs Coalition is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization. The Coalition's fiscal year 2011 budget is \$29 million.

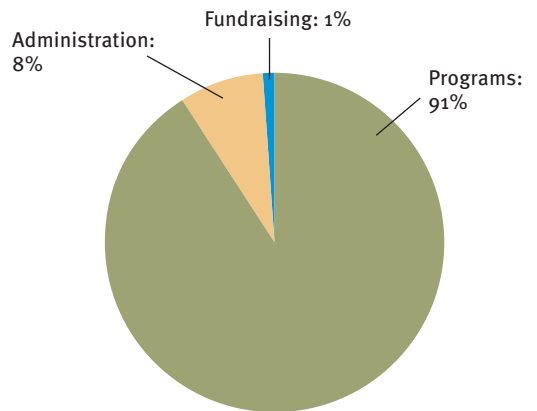
Sources of Support
